

What is a Literary Mystery?

Explanation

It does *not* mean that it is a book about books, lost parchments, libraries, librarians, or writers! Although it would not exclude those characters or settings.

It is not *just* about whether it is well written or not, or easy to read or not. Literary mysteries (like all books) can be well done or poorly written.

The key is this: a literary mystery will - to a greater extent - have some or all nine of the characteristics listed on the left side of the Rating Guide on the right. You can evaluate each of the nine elements along a continuum - as seen on the guide, using check-marks. Four to five checks far to the left of the dotted line probably qualifies it as a literary mystery.

If you end up with check-marks like those shown, it has some "literary qualities" but probably wouldn't be considered a literary mystery. I would suggest that *most of the books we read*, and most of the books marketed as mysteries/thrillers (crime fiction), *are not* literary mysteries.
